"Brief Thoughts on Easter, Spring Cleaning, and Prayer"

While Easter is <u>the</u> springtime – and for that matter all time – ritual "par excellence" for Christians, another well-known and well-kept springtime ritual is "spring cleaning." In keeping with that tradition, I recently began working my way through some boxes of accumulated papers from decades past. Buried in one such box I found a wonderful, and wonderfully honest, prayer composed by an unknown writer which goes as follows:

Dear Lord,
So far today I've done all right.
I haven't gossiped,
haven't lost my temper,
haven't been greedy, grumpy, or nasty,
selfish or over-indulgent.
I'm really glad about that.
But in a few minutes, Lord,
I'm going to get out of bed
and from then on
I'm probably going to need
a lot more help from you.
Thank you in Jesus' name.
Amen.

While I can't speak for you, I personally find this prayer to be not just amusing and clever, but also refreshingly accurate and honest. And therefore, I'm gladly sharing it with you in this season of growth, rebirth, and of course, Easter. Whether you're engaged in any spring cleaning or not these days, I do hope that you are taking time each day for prayer. As this prayer so well illustrates, the best prayers are frequently the simplest and sincerest ones. For prayer is much less a matter of eloquence and length, than of depth and humility.

So may I please suggest that you take time today - or better yet <u>right now</u> - to let God know what's <u>really</u> happening with you? Where, when, and how have you recently experienced happiness, hope, or joy? What are you currently hoping or longing for? Why and what are you worried about? Who or what might strengthen you in the days ahead? And as importantly, when, where, and how might <u>you</u> be a source of comfort and strength for others in the coming days?

Who knows, you just might find more than jellybeans or chocolate-covered eggs in your Easter basket this year? You might just find answered prayers!

But always fresh—always with new tears.



—who we are when no one's looking—


that's our truest self.


