



Pleading, Cursing, Praising: Conversing with God through the Psalms

BOOKS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT CHURCH BEGINNING SUNDAY, OCTOBER 15



Irene Nowell's work would be both impressive and important if she were only" a masterful Scripture scholar or a gifted spiritual guide or a compelling teacher. The fact that she is all three makes her an extraordinary resource for Christians today. In *Pleading*, *Cursing*, *Praising*, Nowell puts all these gifts to use to offer a guide to praying with the psalms.

Nowell maintains that the psalms teach us to tell our story, to cry out our pain, and to give praise to God. They also teach us to listen - to the voice of God, the voice of Christ, the voices of the people around us, and the voice of all creation. This book includes questions and exercises for personal reflection, brief prayers for praying along the way, and suggestions for composing one's own psalm-prayers. It promises to enrich the spiritual life of everyone who reads it.

CHRISTMAS TIME AT ST. MICHAEL'S

This year, as we have done for many years, we will have our St. Margaret's Giving Tree in the Narthex. In the past they have requested hats and mittens... this year, they are requesting the same but with the inclusion of diapers. Their supplier no longer is available to their clients.

Last year we had a great deal of difficulty obtaining a family for our Christmas project. When we finally found a family that needed us, the parish came through with superb results.

This year we are doing something different. We are collecting personal items for the homeless men and women in South Bend. The bags of personal items are called <u>Blessing Bags</u> and they will be distributed to the homeless on Christmas Day after they have their annual Christmas hot meal at Hope Ministries.

Hope Ministries usually serves approximately 100 homeless dinners on Christmas Day. We thought these Blessing Bags would be a great Christmas gift for both men and women. Each week when you come to Church, would you bring one or two of the items on the list (Contents of the Blessing Bags) and put them in the box in the Narthex? We will fill the Blessing Bags on Sunday December 17th after our Sunday service. The Blessing Bags will then be delivered to Hope Ministries for distribution on Christmas day. Your compassion and love for those who are homeless would be greatly appreciated.

Through the frosted window pane, I see a determined thick gray squirrel carefully circling the backyard pond.


Having seen him in the summer taking this same journey to get his fill of water, he is now facing a world as hard as the walnuts in his homemade tree retreat.


