To Know, Live and Share the Love of Christ



I, Mtr. Jen, have been called and sent by Jesus, the Messiah, according to God's plan. . . . I send this letter to you in God's church at St. Michael and All Angels in South Bend, believers cleaned up by Jesus and set apart for a God-filled life. I include in my greeting all who call out to Jesus, wherever they live. He's their Master as well as ours! May all the gifts and benefits that come from God our Father, and the Master, Jesus Christ, be yours. Every time I think of you—and I think of you often!—I thank God for your lives of free and open access to God, given by Jesus. There's no end to what has happened in you—it's beyond speech, beyond knowledge. The evidence of Christ has been clearly verified in your lives. Just think—you don't need a thing, you've got it all! All God's gifts are right in front of you as you wait expectantly for our Master Jesus to arrive on the scene for the Finale. And

not only that, but God himself is right alongside to keep you steady and on track until things are all wrapped up by Jesus. God, who got you started in this spiritual adventure, shares with us the life of his Son and our Master Jesus. He will never give up on you. Never forget that.

The paragraph above is a riff on a riff of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. I began with the paraphrase found in Eugene Peterson's *The Message*, and then changed it to make it a letter from me to you. I didn't have to change much! But it's long; let's break down this opening of Paul's letter to the Corinthians into three sections:

- **Introduction** of the sender and the recipients—Paul and the Church in Corinth, or in this case, me and you. What is beautiful about Paul's introduction is that it continues by including all Christians everywhere, reminding the Corinthians that they are not the only church on the planet, that they are a part of something bigger than themselves.
- **Greeting.** Paul follows the traditional greeting of his time and culture, wishing grace and peace (or gifts and benefits) to the recipients.
- Thanksgiving for the recipients and what God has done and is doing with and through them.

My favorite part of any textual analysis is when we get to this question: "So what?" Who cares about how Paul formulates the beginning of his letter to the Corinthians? And why on earth am I talking about it in my first letter to all of you?

Because, my friends, it says what I want to say to you.

I want you to know that I am here with you. But I also want you to know that the work and the ministry that we will do together for the foreseeable future isn't just about St. Michael and All Angels, because this parish is a part of something much bigger than itself. We are about the whole Church and the world; we are about the Kingdom of God! How exciting and humbling is that?

I want you to know how much I pray for God's grace and peace to be upon each one of you. I pray for this every day, without exception. And because I believe that our prayers are efficacious, this is no small thing!

I also recognize that I am not working with an empty slate. God has been working with and through you for generations already, thanks be to God! I can already see the evidence of Christ clearly verified in your lives! I will be spending much of my time in this initial season of our life together simply walking among you, listening to you, observing you, to see how you have grown, what God has already done with you, and how we might continue to nurture that.

"Just think—you don't need a thing, you've got it all! All God's gifts are right in front of you" (1 Cor 1:7). Do you believe this? Do you believe that as a congregation, God has already given you all that you need? My friends, you MUST believe this, or at least work on believing this. Our God is not a God of scarcity, but of ridiculous abundance! We are not a people of death, but of resurrection! You lack nothing that you need to be a congregation and a people that bears much fruit. Let's work on bearing that fruit together.

Last, we give thanks with Paul that God is faithful in strengthening us, and will be to the end. There is nothing that we can do together that will cause God to abandon us, and when we feel weak, God gives us a share of divine strength. Never forget that.

So let's get to it! I am so excited to join you in ministry, and I cannot wait to see what God has in store for us! Hallelujah!

A brief reflection on day's Scripture lesson followed by a fun activity. Chapel begins at 10:15am and occurs during the first portion of morning worship service.





### Supper Club


